Jodo Shinshu-ists are a group of the Buddhist Sangha who preserves and conveys the wishes, hopes and dedications of the pioneers with highest esteem, to the future Sangha. ~ Essence of Eitaikyo ~

In May, I was invited by the Orange County Buddhist Church (OCBC) to guest speak at their Gotan-e, Birthday celebration of Shinran Shonin. Fumiko's daughter, Mrs. Ann Nakahira greeted me. Ann teaches Japanese Calligraphy and helps with various activities at OCBC. I asked Ann about relatives in Fresno, she said, "my grandparents came from Fresno, and they were devout

I thought "BINGO!" I showed her the photo that I took of the back of the Shinran Shonin's Zushi with the name of the Jinkawa family. She said, "it's my Oji-chan (grandpa) and Oba-chan (grandma)." During the Memorial Day weekend, the Jinkawa family visited our Hondo to see their grand parents' precious memorabilia, Zushi.

Hello to all Fresno Betsuin Sangha Friends! As you may know, our Fresno Betsuin is the newest Hondo of the Buddhist Churches of America (BCA), and the Onaijin, place of conducting Buddhist rituals, enshrined in the center of the

Hondo building. Our Onaijin consists of three pieces of furniture: The center piece, *Kuden*, holds the statue of Amida Tathagata, the central object of reverence (*Goh - Honzon*). On each side of the center piece, are two smaller pieces, *Zushi*. The right displays the portrait of our founder, Shinran Shonin, On the left, displays our 8<sup>th</sup> Monshu, Rennyo Shonin.

For the Hondo Opening Ceremony to be held in April 2022, in March of 2022, the Onaijin, Kuden and two Zushi were moved into the Hondo and re-assembled by generous Sangha volunteers. During the transfer of the pieces to the Hondo, I found a familiar last name written on the back of the Shinran Shonin's Zushi. Written in red ink was, "donated by Tsunayo Jinkawa, 陳川ッナョ in memory of her husband Kiichi Jinkawa 陳川喜一 as Eitaikyo 永代経懇志 Konshi in 1935".

When I moved from Los Angeles to Fresno in 2019, there was a famous and generous kitchen lady, Mrs. Fumiko Jinkawa at Los Angeles Betsuin Buddhist Temple. She is like our Auntie Ruth! I used to see her almost twice a week at the LA Betsuin. All the LA Betsuin members know Mrs. Jinkawa. I called her to ask if the Eitaikyo donor of the Jinkawa family was related to her. Her reply was that she does not remember as is over 90.

 $\mbox{\bf Rev. Briones}$  is the Rimban of the Los Angeles Hompa Hongwanji Buddhist Temple .

He was born and raised in Mountain View, CA. He majored in Biology and worked 28 years as a Research Biologist in the Department of Physiology, at Syntex Pharaceuticals, in Pall Alto. In 1995, he retired and enrolled at the Institute of Buddhist Studies at CA Berkeley's Graduate of Theology Union. upon completion of the ministerial program, Rev. Briones attended Chuo Bukkyo Gakuin (Buddhist Seminary) in Kyoto for 2 years. He received Tokudo ordination in 2000 and Kyoshi certification in 2001. His orientation began at LA Hompa Hongwanji Buddhist Temple in June 2001, joined the ministerial staff in January 2002, and became the Rimban in September 2013.

When I met Mrs. Jinkawa for the first time in five years, she walked closer to the Zushi, and she said "it is unbelievable that my parents donated this precious and sacred furniture to the Fresno Betsuin even though our family was in difficult circumstance at that time. They were truly devout Jodo Shinshuists, and they had a strong aspiration for the presence of Jodo Shinshu here in Fresno. I am proud of them for what they left."

During the Onaijin inspection last month, Mrs. Carolyn Okamoto found in storage, one of the Main Onaijn ornaments, a pair of the hanging lanterns have Japanese engraving which says "(this lantern) for the Betsuin 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary in 1931 by Fresno Betsuin Buddhist Women's Association (FBBWA)". Due to the design of the New Hondo, the ornaments were most likely excluded from the current Onaijin. However, the engraving shows that it was the generous Eitaikyo contribution from our FBBWA.

I have mentioned "Eitaikyo" several times in this article, and you may wonder what that is. If you are a long-time Sangha member and do not know what Eitaikyo is, it is my ministerial fault that you do not know, so let me explain it.

In Kyoto, there is a main mausoleum of Jodo Shinshu called Otani Hombyo, where the cremains of our founder, Shinran Shonin are buried.

According to their explanation, the Eitaikyo is a sacred custom that has been passed down as a practice in which we, who have come to realize the preciousness of life through our own connections and those of the deceased, make offerings to the head temple or affiliated temple, where Jodo Shinshu teachings are heard.

The purpose of this is to ensure that the temple is well preserved and that the teachings of Nembutsu are passed down forever. (Eitai – perpetual, Kyo – Chanting, Ritual, Service)

Furthermore, through the deceased, it is a way for us to express our gratitude for the happiness of our lives, which are sustained by many "Okagesama, our individual life is made by all sentient beings", and it is revealed by the Nembutsu which is the teaching of realization and appreciation to interdependence of life.

Additionally, they explain the reason we conduct an annual Eitaikyo Memorial Service as... this feeling will eventually be passed down to our future Sangha friends, and through the Eitaikyo memorial service, we will become connected to listening to, transmitting, and spreading the teachings. The Eitaikyo memorial service is an expression of your feelings of remembering the deceased and cherishing your connection with the Dharma.

After I became the resident minister at the Fresno Betsuin in March of this year, through old documents in storage, I began to research on how our Betsuin has been maintained. I found one dusty bank box filled with many tarnished files in Japanese, which were most likely left in storage because no one could read the documents. In this box, I found an Eitaikyo donors' list from the 1940's through 1969. Surprisingly, I discovered the name of Tsunayo Jinkawa in the 1940s "Bessyu (special)" Eitaikyo Donors' list. The record confirms that after she donated the Zushi to our Fresno Betsuin, she continued contributing with Eitaikyo to maintain her Zushi donation to be perpetual and to remain well preserved. Mrs. Jinkawa told me that her mother-in-law, Tsunayo lost her husband Kiichi in his forties, leaving a teenager son. His son married Mrs. Jinkawa. Ten years after the loss of her husband, Tsunayo with her son, were incarcerated at Rohwer Arkansas during WWII. Later they returned to Tulare Street, Downtown Fresno and continued supporting Fresno Betsuin with her Eitaikyo. Her son moved to Los Angeles, and when she got old, he attempted to convince his mother to move to LA, but she said "I am happy to live in my house for rest of my life, because I can see the roof of the (downtown) Betsuin from my house every day." The 3-story Betsuin building was a peaceful landmark for many who live in downtown Fresno.

Since the original Onaijin was installed in 1920, hundreds of our Betsuin Sangha members have maintained the Eitaikyo, which is to perpetually fund the maintenance and preservation of the Onaijin in its original condition. Eitaikyo is really an opportunity to cultivate the mind and aspect of the Buddhist view of value in life.

After my new assignment began at Fresno Betsuin in March, several Fresno Betsuin leaders questioned, "What is Eitaikyo? Why is Eitaikyo so important? What is the importance of fixing the Onaijin? Why don't we buy a new one? Why don't we get cheap one?" So, I tried to fully explain what Eitaikyo is, and the reason of Eitaikyo for Fresno Betsuin.

If Eitaikyo donations are not used to maintain the Fresno Betsuin perpetually, why would Tsunayo, a widow and a survivor of internment camp continue her generous donation in memory of her husband, to maintain the Zushi?

Currently, I am working on refurbishing/maintaining several donated monumental items, such as the stone stupa behind the bell tower.

Warm greetings to our Fresno Buddhist Church Betsuin sangha members. Graduations, summer vacations, and more, have started to fill-in the weekends and weeks starting in May, and will continue through the months of June-July-August.

On June 9, 2024, the *Rennyo Shonin Memorial* service was held in the Hondo; the guest speaker, was Reverend Harry Gyokyo Bridge,

and the theme of his Dharma talk was AKA: which many of us know as the acronym for also known as; but for Rev. Bridge, this was his Jodo Shinshu message of A-wareness, K-indness, and A-ppreciation. A special part of the service, ended with the presentation of scholarships to deserving high school graduates, and post-graduate studies students; thanks to chairperson Daryl Doi and his committee, for there hard-work to review applicants and make their selections of the scholarship winners.

As mentioned last month, our Fresno Buddhist Church Betsuin 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration will be held in 2026; thanks to the support and assistance of immediate-past board chairperson Gordon Ah-Tye, the various subcommittee positions were quickly filled at the initial planning meeting. Then, shortly after; I received the good news that sangha members, Jim and Jenny Kubo, have graciously accepted to be the co-chairpersons of the 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary event, which was decided to be a one-day celebration on Sunday, November 8, 2026; thank you so much to Jim & Jenny for volunteering to lead our Fresno Buddhist Church Betsuin in putting together this historic celebration.

One of the special projects currently under review and consideration, as part of the building up to the 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration, is the possible restoration of the onaijin; there are two (2) restoration companies based respectively in Kyoto, Japan and in Hawaii, which will soon be submitting their proposed bids to do this very delicate and detailed work.

Lastly, I wanted to share something personal, with our sangha members, that many were not aware of; since around October 2002 to the present, I was elected the president of the Chuka Hiroshima Kenjinkai ["CHK"]. The purpose of the CHK is to serve as a liaison organization to promote the cultural exchange with our ancestral home, Hiroshima prefecture in Japan, to contribute to the welfare and improvement of the general community, and the Japanese American community. In the past years, since its founding in 1990, there has been a annual social event, held in the month of August, called the *Atomic Bomb Victims Memorial* service, which the purpose is to remember the historical event of the use of the atomic bomb by the United States government during WWII, on the cities of Hiroshima and Nagasaki in the country of Japan.

In 2024, with the support and leadership of the immediate-past Rinban Kakei Nakagawa, and now Reverend Kaz Nakata; I have agreed to invite our sangha members, especially our youth in the CC Jr. YBA, to join the August 4, 2024 annual CHK *Atomic Bomb Victims Memorial* service in the Hondo at 10:00 am, officiated by Rev. Kaz; in addition, a specially arranged video presentation will be shown featuring two (2) high school students from the Hiroshima (Sutoku) high school, a Jodo Shinshu affiliated school, sharing their message in memoriam of the thousands of people who lost their human lives on August 6 & August 9, 1945, respectively. So, please join us.



# Rev. Kaz teaches a Two-Year Youth Buddhist Class every Friday at 5:30PM via Zoom

Since 2019, four Fresno Girls, Makayla Kubo, Kylie Kubo, Izumi Ryan, and Kanon Nakata have completed the "Applied Jodo Shinshu Class", a two-year (74-hour) credit course. This class also covers the requirement for Girl Scouts Cadettes Padma and Boy Scouts Sangha Award. Upon completion of this course, they are entitled to be a Youth Ministerial Assistant (Youth MA) for which hours of ministerial help is counted as community service. Their Youth MA title will remain until graduation from college or age 23, whichever comes first, and they can form their Buddhist club at their college. There are public speaking opportunities, not only at temple/church, but also at local communities.

The first-year class will be provided via zoom and the secondyear class will be hybrid (ritual training at Hondo). The age requirement is 11-19 years old. No application fees required.


