

Hello to all Fresno Betsuin Sangha Friends!
Surprisingly, I have received many comments from Sangha friends, on my last Geppo article explaining the difference between Jodo Shinshu and Shin Buddhism. I initially assumed that everyone was familiar with the fundamental teachings of Jodo Shinshu, but I have come to realize

that this is not the case. Therefore, in this article, I would like to write about the foundational principles of Jodo Shinshu, which formed the basis of the teaching of sono mama ("live as you are"). Please share your thoughts after reading this. Let me know if there are any parts you'd like me to explain in more detail. I'd be happy to cover those topics in future issues.

Since its founding in 1901, Fresno Betsuin has been a temple belonging to the Jodo Shinshu Hongwanji-ha tradition, officially known as Jodo Shinshu. Its founder, Shinran Shonin, was originally a Tendai Buddhist monk who studied under Honen Shonin and later, established Jodo Shinshu in Japan. The head temple is Hongwanji, commonly known as Nishi Hongwanji, located in Kyoto, and the denomination consists of approximately 10,000 temples worldwide and more than 30,000 ordained reverends.

At the center of each temple's main hall (Hondo) is either a statue (wooden or painted) of Amida Tathâgata or a scroll inscribed with Namo Amida Butsu, which serves as the principal image of reverence (honzon). Jodo Shinshu is a community of people who are embraced by the teachings of Amida Tathâgata and recite the Nembutsu (Namo Amida Butsu).

These teachings are based on three sutras delivered by Shakyamuni Tathâgata —the Larger Sutra of Immeasurable Life (Bussetsu Muryojukyo), the Contemplation Sutra (Bussetsu Kanmuryojukyo), and the Amida Sutra (Bussetsu Amidakyô)—as well as texts written by Shinran Shonin, such as the Shoshin Ge, Jodo Wasan, Koso Wasan, and Shozomatsu Wasan, and the Gobunsho written by Rennyo Shonin. Commonly used chants in Sunday services, such as the Juseige and Sanbutsuge, are passages from the Larger Sutra of Immeasurable Life, while the Shoshin Ge is recited during funeral services.

The central teaching is that through the power of Amida Buddha's Primal Vow, one receives Shinjin (entrusting heart) and follows a life of Nembutsu. When one's life in this world ends, they will become a part of our memory, and return to this world of delusion to guide others (Genso Ekou). I will provide a detailed explanation of the teachings on Shinjin and Genso Ekou in future issues.

As a way of life, one follows the teachings of Shinran Shonin by listening to the true intent of Amida Tathâgata's teaching, reflecting on oneself while reciting the Nembutsu, and living with both humility and gratitude. Rather than relying on worldly prayers for personal gain, one embraces a life of gratitude and appreciation.

The followers of Jodo Shinshu are a fellowship (Dôbô Kyôdan) who revere the teachings of Shinran Shonin and come together in the practice of Nembutsu. They form a community dedicated to sharing the wisdom and compassion taught in the teaching of Amida Tathâgata. Through this, they contribute to the realization of a society where both oneself and others can live with spiritual fulfillment and peace.

Traditionally, members of the Fresno Betsuin are referred to as Sangha. However, in Jodo Shinshu, the proper term is Monto (followers of the Jodo Shinshu). Therefore, the ceremonial stole worn around the neck during any Jodo Shinshu service is called the Monto Shikisho (ceremonial recognition stole).

In Jodo Shinshu, the attainment of enlightenment does not depend on the practitioner's actions, such as "accumulating merit". The teaching of Amida Tathâgata is the vow to bring all beings to the state of enlightenment, and there are no conditions placed upon us to receive it. Thus, our recitation of the Nembutsu is an expression of gratitude for the teaching of Amida Tathâgata —this is known as Goon-hôsha (expressing gratitude for the benevolence and compassion of Amida Tathâgata's teaching).

From the above, you can understand that Jodo Shinshu is a teaching in which one attains enlightenment by living as you are and reciting the Nembutsu. I sincerely hope that you all live within this wonderful teaching. Gassho.

### "THE POTENTIAL OF JODO SHINSHU AND YOUTH PROPAGATION"

Rev. Iwohara received his novice ordination (tokudo) in 1983 while an exchange student at the International Christian University as an undergraduate studying at UCLA. After receiving his B.A. from UCLA in Psychology, Rev. John then received an MA degree in Community and Social Psychology from Wilfrid Laurier University in Canada. While in Canada, he helped out at the Toronto Buddhist Church. Following this, he began his formal studies in Jodo Shinshu Buddhism at Ryukoku University. After earning the MA degree in Shinshu Studies, he was allowed to continue with my doctorate studies in Jodo Shinshu through a grant from the Japanese government.

Rev. John has served the Buddhist Churches of America (BCA) temples for over 25 years, for Fresno, Vista, Seattle, Venice (Los Angeles), and currently assigned to the Gardena Buddhist Church (GBC). At the GBC, he also serves as the Headmaster to the Wisteria Chugakko (Middle School) Summer School Program, as well as an advisor to the Ichi-mi ("single flavor") club. Ichi-mi is organized for LGBTQ+ and allies and is an officially recognized affiliate organization of the GBC.

### Meaning of Namo Amida Butsu

In church, we say Namo Amida Butsu usually at least once every time we go. It's either after church, starting classes for the kids, and so on. But, do you know the real meaning behind it? Why do we say it? Well, continue reading if you want to find out!

Namo Amida Butsu can be split into two words. Namu and Amida Butsu. Namu means "I take refuge". This word came originally from namaste. Amida Butsu actually doesn't have a meaning to it. But, in the different language called Sanskrit, the word Namo Amida Butsu is split into two words. Namo and Amita abha. Namo has the same meaning as Namu. In our culture, we mixed these two different ways to write it and changed it to Namo. However, Amita means immeasurable. Bha means light or connection.

When you put the two words together, Namo Amida Butsu means I trust you with connection. Now, how does this translate into why we say this is because the whole purpose of saying is that you are saying, "I take refuge in everything that helps me live." Certain things you eat are a great example of this. Lets say, you eat a store bought muffin for breakfast. Now ask yourself, where do you get this muffin from? The grocery store, right? But, what leads to the grocery store having these muffins? A delivery truck. How does the delivery truck get its food? From a production area where the muffin will be made. Where does the production area get the ingredients from to make a muffin? A farmer with the resources of a person, sun, water, and etc. My point is, one thing is the outcome to a long process of why you are living. These types of steps are applied in everyday use. Like clothes, pens, paper, and much more.

So, the whole point of saying Namo Amida Butsu in church is saying that you take refuge in everything that helps you live your life. You acknowledge the reasons and steps caused for you to come to the church. You acknowledge why you live, for our food sources, and much more. It just means that you're thankful for the connection the steps do to help you get to where you are living today. Even though you don't realize it everyday, without these steps, we wouldn't be alive. Make sure you always remember that the things you do in life are caused by a root and steps to help you get there.

### Rev. Kaz teaches a Two-Year Youth Buddhist Class every Friday at 6:00PM



Since 2019, four Fresno Girls, Makayla Kubo, Kylie Kubo, Izumi Ryan, and Kanon Nakata have completed the "Applied Jodo Shinshu Class", a two-year (74-hour) credit course.

This class also covers the requirement for Girl Scouts Cadettes Padma and Boy Scouts Sangha Award. Upon completion of this course, they are entitled to be a Youth Ministerial Assistant (Youth MA) for which hours of ministerial help is counted as community service. Their Youth MA title will remain until graduation from college or age 23, whichever comes first, and they can form their Buddhist club at their college. There are public speaking opportunities, not only at temple/church, but also at local communities.

The first-year class will be provided in Rev. Kaz' Dharma Center office and the second-year class will be ritual training in the Hondo. The age requirement is 11-19 years old. No application fees required.

### NEW DATE!! Saturday, May 31, 2025


To avoid the heat of summer, we are moving Obon to May 31, 2025.



Heard But Not Seen

### Kansho Bell Heard But Not Seen Kansho Bell Seen But Not Heard

The Kansho: "the calling bell" can be found in three locations on the Fresno Betsuin complex. The large 3000-pound bell within our bell tower has been well documented since it was received in 1979 donated by Mr. Yehan Numata, a successful industrialist in Japan and devout Jodo Shinshu Buddhist. The bell is usually rung at Obon and New Years. There are two other smaller bells in different locations.



Seen But Not Heard

The first is "heard but not seen". In a corner nook behind the Onaijin is a bell that is rung before each service prior to the entrance of the ministers. There does not appear to be any documented history but the inscription on the bell says "**Donation to the Fresno Buddhist Church T. Hirayama Nov 1902.** We can only speculate that this is the first bell used at the original downtown Buddhist Temple on Kern St. What is unusual is that there is a crack in the bell which appears to have been repaired with a weld. Our best guess is that in 1919, the original temple burned down and fell to the ground from the third story resulting in the crack. Because of the weld, the sound is a little different but just as effective.

When we moved into the Family Dharma Center, we built a small iron/wood covering under which we placed another Kansho Bell near the southwest corner of the Dharma Center. While we were having services in the Dharma Center, the bell was rung before each service. Unfortunately, several years ago before we put up our security fence, the bell was stolen. But fortunately, we had another bell in storage. Late last year Justin Lesser, a Boy Scout seeking an eagle scout project, put forth the idea of rebuilding the cover and installing the bell. The inscription on this bell was "Fresno Buddhist Temple H. Nakagawa T. Jitsumyo". Because of the completion of our new Temple, it is anticipated that this bell will not be heard unless there is a special service nearby. Thus, it is anticipated that it will be "seen but not heard".

There was no plan to restore these bells, but just wanted to share with you a little bit of historic information.
